### SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

### 1. Who can apply for the ECDA Awards?

For individual awards, the nomination is open to all Singapore Citizens or Permanent Residents who are in-service ECDA-approved infant or early years educators, preschool educators, centre leaders and Early Intervention teacher or Learning Support educators. They must meet the specific training and experience stipulated in the ECDA Awards nomination forms for the respective Award categories.

For centre awards, nominated centres must be a licensed Early Childhood Development Centre (ECDC) that fulfils the eligibility criteria stipulated in the nomination form.

## 5. What is SPARK?

The Singapore Preschool Accreditation Framework (SPARK) is a quality assurance framework to help our preschools improve their quality. SPARK aims to recognise and support preschool leaders in their efforts to improve teaching and learning, and administration and management processes to enhance the holistic development and well-being of young children.

It serves as a benchmark for preschools to measure their quality and establish for themselves the extent of their achievement.

SPARK has been implemented since January 2011. Childcare centres and kindergartens may apply for SPARK Assessment via four application windows in a year. To find out more about the SPARK certification, visit <u>https://go.gov.sg/spark-about</u>.

# 6. What is the SPARK (Commendation)?

Introduced in 2015, SPARK Certification (Commendation) is awarded to centres with strong processes in Teaching and Learning, as well as Curriculum, and Pedagogy.

# 7. What is 'Start Small Dream Big'?

The 'Start Small Dream Big' (SSDB) movement was initiated by ECDA in 2015 to encourage preschools to create platforms for children to give back to the community. It was first launched as part of SG50 and the 15th anniversary of President's Challenge, as an annual series of fund-raising and volunteer activities. Participating preschools design and implement community service projects for the

The SSDB movement aspires to nurture each child holistically, including character building, so that they can succeed individually in life and become responsible citizens who care about those around them.
